What are the most important things to see?		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Badger Hole – Badger Clark's log cabin – poet laureate • 7,100 acres of granite peaks and rugged terrain • 1,300 bison running free • Lakes, trail rides, mini-dude ranch • Mt. Coolidge fire tower • Gordon Stockade – third replica- used by gold miners for protection from Lakotas – gold miners were trespassing on Lakota reservation 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sculptor Studio – tools and techniques used in sculpting faces • Lakota, Nakota, and Dakota Heritage Village on the Presidential Trail • Evening lighting Ceremony – 45 minutes on presidents, patriotism, and national history • Carver's Café and Ice Cream! 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Night Blasts on June 26 – pyrotechnic display, plus laser show • Indian Museum of North America and Native American Education and Cultural Center • Korczk's Studio and Home
What information would be useful to know		
<p>1868 USJ gov't signed treaty with Lakota and Cheyenne – gave a large portion of South Dakota to the Plains Indians – until gold was discovered</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Who are the presidents? – Lincoln, Washington, Theodore Roosevelt and Jefferson • Susan B. Anthony was considered to joined them, but they chose Roosevelt instead • Not everyone was supportive to carve presidents on the mountain because Lakota considered the mountain to be sacred • 5,725 ft above sea level, 60 ft faces 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Carved in response to Mt Rushmore – 17 miles away in the Black Hills • Once completed – was the largest outdoor sculpture in the world • Sculpting hand tools and a single drill • 36 years of his life was dedicated to this project • Moved 7000 tons of granite from the site
