The museum is in its 9th year of operation and focuses on what really happened at Wounded Knee. Photos in the museum and on the webpage are from the Smithsonian and several historical societies with many thanks given to the Lakota people for providing much of the information presented. The museum will be turned over to the Lakota people once it becomes financially viable.

Exhibits span from Pre-Columbian America to issues facing Native Americans today. According to the museum webpage, it is a narrative museum that focuses on “the story of a small band of Lakota families.” A virtual tour of the museum, as well as a movie is available online.
